Adjudicator finds Alberta Securities Commission has control over the National Registration Database

An Adjudicator with the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner has ruled that the Alberta Securities Commission has control over the National Registration Database. Information within that database is, therefore, subject to the correction provisions within the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.

The Applicant made a correction request to the Alberta Securities Commission requesting that the Alberta Securities Commission remove her personal information from the National Registration Database.

The Alberta Securities Commission refused to amend or delete the information within the National Registration Database stating that it did not have custody or control of that information.

The Adjudicator held that the Alberta Securities Commission had control over the permanent records within the National Registration Database and ordered the Alberta Securities Commission to annotate or link the Applicant's correction request to the database.

The Adjudicator also addressed the Alberta Securities Commission's annotation and linkage of its paper registration file as well as its authority to collect, use and disclose the Applicant's personal information.
